Fees paid with Application (non-refundable)

Application Fee	\$50	Paid once for each program (e.g. year 2 and 3 of Weekend programs do not need to pay this.)
Application Fee	\$70	for application in after June 1 for Summer; after August 15 for September registrations
Financial Aid Application Fee	\$15	(for students taking out a loan or requesting a scholarship)

Students attending classes without signing student contracts, loan contracts, or completing tuition payment will be charged **additional** late fees in **\$100 increments** every 7 days from the 1st day of class (i.e. on the 6th day of class the late fee is \$100, on day 8 the late fee is \$200, etc.).

Student Expenses in Summer: Students in the Summer Waldorf Education Programs should expect to spend \$250 for books and other items such as eurythmy shoes, arts supplies and musical instruments each year. Living expenses for a single student are approximately \$260/week

Student Expenses in Fall: Students in the Waldorf Education Programs should expect to spend \$550-\$600 for books and other items such as eurythmy shoes, arts supplies and musical instruments. Students in other programs should expect to spend \$200-300 for books, eurythmy shoes and arts supplies. Living expenses for a single student are approximately \$900-\$950 per month in Fair Oaks.

All Teacher Training Student expenses: Students who are not already teaching may incur additional travel expenses associated with practice teaching and may need to have a one-time TB test (approx. \$15-\$20) and one or two Livescans (electronic fingerprint check) costing up to \$68 ea. Some states may require a physical exam. The student is responsible for contacting the Waldorf school they are assigned to for details. Students who are teaching may incur telephone expenses for mentoring or faculty meal expenses for required visits for observation.

Students in the San Francisco and Peninsula Teacher Ed. Programs: 1) are required to attend a summer semester in Fair Oaks and all living expenses are the responsibility of the student (approximately \$500 per year); 2) may have weekly refreshment expenses (approx. \$50 from Sept-May).

BUYER'S RIGHT TO CANCEL: Students may cancel their enrollment agreement in writing at any time and will be eligible for a full refund of all refundable fees, if cancellation is received prior to or on the first day of instruction. Notice of cancellation must be addressed to the Admissions Officer, Rudolf Steiner College, 9200 Fair Oaks Boulevard, Fair Oaks, California 95826. Cancellation shall be effective upon receipt of **written notice**. Cancellation of enrollment received after the first day of instruction will be refunded according to the refund statement below. Students who wish to cancel enrollment are encouraged to consult with the Admissions Officer.

REFUND POLICY: All refunds will be processed within 30 days of cancellation notice. If cancellation occurs prior to or on the first day of instruction, a full refund of all refundable fees (see fee schedule), minus a \$100 registration fee will be made. If cancellation is made after the first day of instruction and prior to 60% completion of the program, a pro rata refund will be calculated on the basis of clock hours remaining for completion of the program minus a \$100 registration fee. **If cancellation occurs after 60% of program completion, no refund will be made.** Example: If a student withdraws after attending 200 clock hours of an 800 clock hour program, the refund will be based on 600 clock hours divided by 800 clock hours (75%) minus \$100 administration fee. If a student withdraws after attending 600 clock hours of an 800-clock hour program, no refund will be made.

Refunds apply to complete withdrawals only. **There are no refunds for classes or courses missed within a program.** Students have the option of being a part-time or custom student and will be charged at a different rate per unit. Students who do not attend classes for three consecutive weeks, without notifying the Admissions Office, will be automatically withdrawn and no refund will apply.

***NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF UNITS AND DEGREES EARNED AT RUDOLF STEINER**

COLLEGE: Units earned at Rudolf Steiner College in most cases will probably not be transferable to any other college or university. For example, if you enter Rudolf Steiner College as a freshman, you will still be a freshman if you enter another college or university at some time in the future even though you earned units at Rudolf Steiner College. The transferability of units earned at Rudolf Steiner College is entirely up to the transferee institution over which Rudolf Steiner College has no authority. In addition, if you earn a degree, diploma or certificate at Rudolf Steiner College, in most cases it will probably not serve as a basis for obtaining a higher level degree at another college or university.
