



Little Ones and Eurythmy

June 24-25, 2017

with Molly Collum and Alice Stamm

In this workshop participants will begin their day with eurythmy and then learn the history, theory, and uses for the Little One Pedagogical Dolls. Each participant will make a Little One and receive clothing patterns.

Participants should bring small sewing kit that includes: thimble and scissors.

Molly Collum has been working in Waldorf early childhood education for 25 years. She has enhanced her work with therapeutic workshops and with the Gradalis Early Childhood Therapeutic Training under the direction of Bonnie River and William Bento. It was in the Gradalis Training where Molly first learned about the Little One Therapeutic Dolls and she began teaching the Little One workshops. Molly currently teaches kindergarten at the Berkeley Rose School and incorporates therapeutic activities and helps the Little Ones find their own true children.

Alice Stamm has been teaching eurythmy since 1975. She began her eurythmy training in Eckwalden, Germany and finished with Else Klink in Stuttgart. She has taught in trainings, Waldorf schools, and performance work in Chicago, Los Angeles, and now in Fair Oaks. She enjoys teaching kindergarten eurythmy, and eurythmy to adults at RSC. She is president of the Eurythmy Association of North America and helped to form the Section Collegium for the Performing Arts in North America in 1988.
